# **Presidents Report**

It is indeed an honour to be able to present this report. This year we had a very good year on and off the green.

On the green, we conducted another successful Gala week of Bowls with the State championships. This year was the third under the new concept, with each Region hosting the event. Although the numbers were down compared to the past 2 years it was the first year the Bowlers with Disabilities Championships were included within the Gala week. Numbers for this event doubled on previous years.

The Senior Championships were once again a great success and proved to be a popular event.

The Junior Championships were held at a different time of the year and was not supported that well. The quality of the bowls played were of a high standard. A working group will be established to assist in the delivery and timing of these championships.

All the championships will be reviewed over the winter to try and determine what is best, where is best and when is best. We have circulated surveys to members to assist with this review.

Once again the concept of the State Wide Challenge proved popular and was keenly contested.

Our State open sides competed at the National Sides Championships in Adelaide. The display from all involved was nothing short of brilliant.

The team achieved the best result a Tassie team has ever accomplished. The Ladies had a competitive championship with good results. The final placings did not accurately depict the

consistency and professionalism displayed. The men were outstanding finishing a very, very close runners up in the Alley shield. They were only beaten once during the championship period, going down by three shots to the eventual winners, South Australia. The team earnt immense respect from all other states with their professionalism and determination. The applause at the presentation was long and loud. The combined overall result of third was the best ever for our team.

Another significant outcome on the Green was that of our CEO at the world Championships in New Zealand. Two more World Titles to her credit. We as a state gain a lot out of her success. Congratulations Bec and best wishes in your quest for selection for the Commonwealth Games team.

Congratulations to all our Representatives, Coaches, Managers and Selectors who have built this stated into a respected and competitive organisation.

Off the Green we continue to maintain a healthy, transparent financial structure with easy to understand financial reports.

Initiatives introduced through the year Come and Try days and Women Coaching Women have been judged a success and should only grow in the future.

The initiative of the Cash Back Living has the potential to assist those clubs that want to help themselves gain a residual income stream. Bows Tasmania(BTAS) will continue to work with the clubs wherever it can.

The members of the Board were involved with a self-appraisal programme, conducted by the Australian Sports Commission. All States and Territories(STA's), who are the members of Bowls Australia(BA), did the same. The results highlighted the areas each STA needs to focus on.

Governance at all levels, Club, Region and State is an area that we all should concentrate on. BTAS will shortly commence work on the new Strategic Plan (once Bowls Australia has finished theirs). Regions and Clubs are encouraged to align their Strategic plans with the plans from BA and BTAS.

The Constitution work that is needed, is continuing to be a work in progress, as is policy development and review.

The future is looking strong for the organisation both in financial and governance terms.

I would like to sincerely thank our supporters and business partners, without their assistance, the task at hand would be far greater, if achieved at all.

I would like thank the Directors, their work throughout the year is very much appreciated. We have made great inroads to where we should be and still have a bit to go. Thank you.

We have two Directors stepping down this year. Marion your efforts with the Bowlers with Disabilities portfolio has been appreciated culminating with the doubling of entries and inclusion in the Gala week of Bowls, well done. The other departing Director, Chris Lee. Your vision, drive, enthusiasm, passion and persistence, transformed our High Performance program into

something you should be very proud of.

In conversation in 2014, it was stated the aim was "A top three finish by 2018". With restructuring, changes to procedures and policies and subsequent changes in attitude, congratulations job well done and thank you.

# **Chief Executive Officer Report**

#### **Participation**

This year we created our state wide Try Bowls campaign with an offer to all 70 clubs across Tasmania to come on board and be a part of this exciting initiative. This was deemed a success in its first attempt. We now have our own TV commercial that we can use to air on both television and social media platforms. This has also allowed us to investigate options in approaching free to air television stations to air our commercial and develop new corporate partnerships. The best part of this initiative was the joint collaboration between Bowls Tasmania and the regions in making this a success. We also enjoyed the introduction of our Women in Sport coaching tour that was aimed at the grass roots of our sport. The feedback we received on this was simply amazing.

We have hit some stumbling blocks with some of our strategic initiatives in this area, namely one set of Conditions of Play and the Hall of Fame.

# **High Performance**

Our High Performance strategic priority has been a huge success for Bowls in Tasmania. This plan commenced in 2014 and has been improving each year culminating in our most successful representative year which included; ACT Test victories for both the men and women's open teams, two silver medals at the junior nationals, VIC Test victory for the junior boys, QLD Test victory for the Open Men's Team, Silver Medal for the open men's team at the Alley Shield for the first time and Tasmania's greatest ever overall performance in third place.

#### **Events**

Our events continue to be an important focus for Bowls Tasmania with the continued success of the Gala Week. The Gala Week will grow more this year with the introduction of the junior championships being held with it along with the disability championships after its introduction this past season. The Veolia SWC continues to be our premier region vs region competition at an open, senior and junior level.

# Commercial Development

Commercial Development has become a greater focus in my role this past season, particularly developing relationships with new, existing and potential sponsors. We have developed a new partnership with the ANZ to solely benefit our Tasmania Bowls Clubs. This program based on a referral system is a great opportunity for clubs to raise extra funds for their clubs with very little work. The success of this program is completely dependent on how well the clubs grab this opportunity.

We move into an exciting time with the potential that the Cash Back Living program can do for Bowls Tasmania and our clubs. There is a great opportunity for clubs to again benefit themselves through this program.

#### **Leadership & Governance**

The leadership and governance displayed by the board of Bowls Tasmania has been a breath of fresh air and I sincerely congratulate each and every board member on their work in this area and the work they have done to better themselves and learn new things. I would like to also thank them in their support in my role, it has been great to work with you for another year. We have been undertaking reviews of our internal and external operational procedures and we have certainly made some huge leaps forward in these areas. We are continuing with the review and implementation of our policies.

#### **Communications**

Our social media initiatives have reached new heights this year. Throughout the Gala Week alone our website and Facebook reached over 68,000 hits. We have just started learning to use the email component of our membership database so we can communicate more with the individual members and keep them in the know on what is happening. We have begun surveying our members to gather feedback to assist us with our reviews and to start being more interactive with our members. The communication between Bowls Tasmania and the regions has certainly improved and I would like to thank Rob, Gaylene, Bob Franklin and Gwenda for their support in this area. It has been enjoyable to work with you all.

Going forward I certainly hope that Bowls Tasmania and the regions can begin to work more harmoniously with the single goal of bettering Bowls in Tasmania, increasing participation in our sport and growing the game to new heights.

## **Treasurers Report**

A Deficit of \$2,000 was incurred for the year. The result while not achieving our budgeted projection was close to our Financial Plan for the year after allowing for the abnormal write down of Stock on Hand of \$9,000.

Revenue showed increased return in Capitation Fees \$6,000 (although fee paying members decreased by 175). Sponsorship increased by \$7,000, while Entry Fees were down by \$5,000. The continued support from Sport & Recreation is noted and much appreciated and I thank Rebecca & Garry for their efforts in once again securing this grant.

Expenses overall are in line with budget, with prizemoney up by \$7,000 and abnormal Legal fees of \$3,000 offset by savings in other areas. This result has been achieved with a lot of effort and thanks go to Rebecca and assistant Warren and to our sponsors for their support.

The Finance, Risk & Audit Committee has presented the 2017/18 Budget to the Board for approval at our next meeting. The bottom line shows a surplus of \$4000. The committee has not factored in income from the Cash Back App initiative, but is confident that once established the App will provide extra income for Bowls Tasmania.

The Finance, Risk & Audit Committee with the endorsement of the Board recommends that the current Capitation Fees of Adults \$48 and Juniors \$33 not be increased for the 2017/18 year.

#### Notes to the Financial Statements

#### 1 Accounting Policies

These financial statements are a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the accounts preparation requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (Tasmania) 1964.

The board of directors have determined that Bowls Tasmania Inc is not a reporting entity and therefore there is no need to apply Australian Accounting Standards or other manadatory professional reporting requirements in the preparation and presentation of the financial statements.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, financial assets and financial liabilities for which the fair value basis of accounting has been applied.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with previous periods unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report:

#### (a) Property, Plant & Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including buildings and capitalised leased assets, is depreciated on a straight-line basis over their useful lives commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

#### (b) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the balance sheet are shown inclusive of GST.

#### (c) Revenue Recognition

Grant revenue is recognised within the operating statement on a progressive basis over the lifetime of the grant.
